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HISTORY



Villefranche-sur-Mer is a quaint fishing village located in the hear of the Cote d'Azur region of the French Riviera. It is an exclusive area where celebrities and the wealthy are known to get away. Villefranche sits on one of the most stunning and deepest natural harbors on the Mediterranean.

This city was also the site of a Russian Naval Base in the 19th century and a US Naval Base from 1948 until 1966.

MONEY
